1. Call to Order/Roll Call

2. Consider Minutes from January 6, 2022

4. Consent Agenda

On motion of M. Corona, second by B. Ash, the commission approved claims for the months of January and February 2022 and Resolution 2022-0002 regarding remote teleconferencing meetings; motion carried by roll call vote.

5. Correspondence: RCRC Telecommunications JPA

John informed commissioners that the Board of Directors of RCRC (Rural County Representatives of California) voted to approve the formation of Golden State Connect Authority JPA for the purpose of expanding broadband access and quality in rural counties. D Carter provided information on RCRC and advised members that more information is to come.

6. Conduct Public Hearing regarding the Proposed 2022-2023 Colusa LAFco Budget

3:11 - Opened Public Hearing

John reported that the Budget Committee met and reviewed the budget. A couple minor adjustments were made due to pandemic expenses. The Calafco membership has increased by \$64; from \$1,808 to \$1,872. Communications expenses has decreased by \$600 to \$800. There are no other changes. The reserve will remain at \$60,000.

On motion by M. Corona, second by G. Ponciano, the commission approved Resolution 2022-0003 adopting a proposed 2022-2023 Colusa LAFCo Budget; motion carried by roll call vote.

John stated that once a service review is complete, some follow-up should be provided. The majority of districts do a good job; however, some are under performing and require some follow-up and encouragement to get with the program. This resolution will make follow-up part of the MSR procedure.

John stated that the only follow-up is that Calafco is proposing legislation, carried by Senator Hertzberg, for a 25% protest threshold in order to cause an election or terminate a proposal. Calafco is initiating a letter campaign. John will provide a copy at the next LAFCo meeting.
