Public Comment

Colusa LAFCO

- No action shall be taken on items not appearing on the agenda unless otherwise authorized by Government Code Section 54954.2 (known as the Brown Act, or California Open Meeting Law).
- The total amount of time allotted for receiving public comment may be limited to 15 minutes.
- Any individual's testimony may be limited to 5 minutes. Time to address the Commission will be allocated on the basis of the number of requests received.

Public Hearings

Members of the public may address the Commission on any item appearing on the agenda as a Public Hearing. The Commission may limit any person's input to 5 minutes. Written statements may be submitted in lieu of or to supplement oral statements made during a public hearing.

Materials related to an item on this agenda submitted to the Commission after distribution of the agenda area available for review for public inspection in the Colusa County Clerk's office located at the Colusa County Courthouse 546 Jay Street, Colusa CA. [such documents are also available on the Colusa LAFCO website as noted below to the extent practicable and subject to staff's ability to post the documents prior to the meeting].

An interpreter for the hearing-impaired may be made available upon request to the Executive Officer 72 hours before a meeting. The location of this meeting is wheelchair-accessible.

#### Disclosure & Disqualification Requirements

Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56100.1, 56300(b), 56700.1, and 81000 et seq., and Colusa LAFCO's Policies and Procedures for the Disclosure of Contributions and Expenditures in Support of and Opposition to Proposals, any person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contribute \$1000 or more or expend \$1000 or more in support of or opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Colusa LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements approved by Colusa LAFCO. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals. A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

#### Dear Ms Vandervall:

The Colusa Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) is beginning the state-mandated Sphere of Influence (SOI) update and related Municipal Service Review (MSR). Pursuant to Government Code Section 56425, since there has never been a MSR and SOI prepared for the district and it has come to LAFCo's attention a MSR and SOI is being prepared at this time.

As you may be aware, Government Code Section 56425 requires LAFCos to establish and maintain SOIs for each agency under its jurisdiction. An SOI is defined by statute as "a plan for the probable physical boundaries and service area of a local agency as determined by the Commission." In conjunction with the SOI updates, Government Code Section 56430 requires LAFCo conduct MSRs that "comprehensively review all of the agencies that provide the identified service or services within the designated geographic region."

To assist Colusa LAFCo in the MSR/SOI (Municipal Service Review and Sphere of Influence) update process for Colusa Basin District services within its boundaries in portions of Colusa, Yolo and Glenn Counties, we are requesting that you provide respond to our questions information by **Friday, February March 1st**, **2024**.

# Questions:

Section 127-20 (a) of Chapter 127 states ".....Limited outlet capacity and limited drainage capacity with the basin result in periodic extensive flooding throughout the basin. This problem needs to be studied and addressed"

flooding of adjacent lands may occur even during the normal drainage season. This problem needs to be studied and addressed".

Section 127-20 (c) states the following: "Certain areas within the Colusa Basin appear to be experiencing subsidence which may add to the flooding and drainage problems occurring within the basin. This problem needs to be studied and addressed".

Section 127-21 of the CBDD Act regarding the necessity of the CBDD Act states "While the problems of <u>flooding and winter drainage</u>, <u>irrigation drainage</u>, <u>and subsidence</u> which are occurring within the Colusa Basin are multicounty in scope, but are unique to the Colusa Basin and are not general or statewide. A special act to address these problems is, therefore, necessary.

**Question #1** Since its inception what has the district completed a study and address flooding and winter drainage, irrigation drainage, and subsidence as mentioned above within its boundaries? If so, please elaborate

Question #2 Has the district designated benefit zones and for what purpose? Please let LAFCO know the location and purposes of each benefit zone.

Question #3 Has the district completed and approved a plan for the improvement or mitigation of drainage, flooding, and subsidence problems per Section 127-610? Has such a plan been approved by the voters? Please elaborate and explain.

**Question #4** How many parcels are in the district, a statement of the assessments levied and the purpose of the assessment? Please elaborate and explain.

The following is an information request. Requested are documents or information items LAFCo's typically request when preparing a MSR and SOI:

- 1. Copy of Detailed Budget for the past three years including expenditures and revenues.
- 2. Copy of Audits for the past two years
- 3. Information regarding Bonded Indebtedness if so explain
- 4. Board Members and contact Information, Terms of office, Officers of the Board
- Board Agendas and Minutes, meeting schedule and location for the past year
- 6. District Plans and Work Programs going forward
- 7. Current Grants
- 8. A District organizational chart
- 9. Revenue Generated and Fee schedule and ordinances, if applicable
- 10. Projects completed
- 11. Projects in progress, explain and describe project
- 12. Describe Projects planned for the future

- 13. Insurance, Risk Management
- 14. Land owned by District, the purpose and plans or projects for land owned by the District
- 15. Requirements of Federal and State Legislation and how these requirements are met
- 16. Copy of the Federal Legislation authorizing the CBDD
