Public Comment

Disclosure & Disqualification Requirements

Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56100.1, 56300(b), 56700.1, and 81000 et seq., and Colusa LAFCO's Policies and Procedures for the Disclosure of Contributions and Expenditures in Support of and Opposition to Proposals, any person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contribute \$1000 or more or expend \$1000 or more in support of or opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Colusa LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements approved by Colusa LAFCO. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals. Colusa LAFCO

A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION COLUSA COUNTY MINUTES OF MEETING October 5th, 2023

1. Call to Order/Roll Call:

Chair, Ponciano called the meeting to order at 3:02 p.m. There was a quorum present.

2. Consider Meeting Minutes from September 7, 2023.

The minutes from September 7, 2023, were continued to the next meeting.

3. Public Comment:

Ben King, landowner, stated the General Manager for SOI GCID has resigned. He also made a correction in his assumption of the salt load regarding the contamination of ground water at the Colusa and Sacramento Refuge.

4. Consent Agenda:

a. Payment of Claims for the month September, 2023.

Action: Upon motion from Commissioner Corona, and a second from Commissioner Bell, the commission approved the consent agenda; Motion carried by roll call vote.

5. Correspondence:

John Benoit explained the upcoming CALAFCo Conference agenda has been sent out.

6. Colusa Basin Drainage District (CBDD)

John Benoit asked Counsel to make determination as to Colusa LAFCO's specific jurisdiction and obligations regarding the Colusa Basin Drainage District.

John Benoit stated he would be Inviting the Colusa Basin Drainage District General Manager to a future LAFCO Meeting.

Ben King explained the need to have a MSR and SOI Update prepared.

7. Colusa County Water District Annexation and Minor Sphere Amendment (File 2023-0001).

John Benoit gave a summary of the Executive Officer Report

Shelly Murphy explained the Colusa County Water District's capacity to provide water.

Public Hearing:

Mike (last name unknown) questions whether there is adequate water supply and expressed concern of adding acreage to the district. He raised the question of inadequate notification to neighbors and wonders about the 218 ramifications.

Shelly Murphy explained the applicants were the ones to reach out to the district and explained others have the same opportunity to submit a letter to the district.

Action:

- 1. Upon motion of Commissioner Bell and seconded by Commissioner Corona, the commission unanimously voted to approve LAFCO Resolution 2023-0006 adopting a 123.32 acre Sphere of Influence Amendment for Colusa County Water District
- 2. Upon motion of Commissioner Ponciano and seconded by Commissioner Bell, the commission unanimously voted to approve LAFCo Resolution 2023-0007 annexing 758 acres more or less to the Colusa County Water District.

8. Executive Officer's Report:

- a. Williams Service Review John Benoit stated staff is working on a Municipal Service Review for Williams.
- b. Calafco Conference John Benoit briefed the commission on the upcoming CALAFCo Conference.

9. Commissioner Reports:

Scott Brown, LAFCO Counsel explained there is a new proposition on the November ballot, and if passed will affect LAFCO annexations in the future. The proposition is intended to further Prop 218 to fill in loopholes that have been used and would require any geographical extension into a district (that already has a special tax) to be conditioned upon a Prop 218.

10. Next Colusa LAFCO meeting: The next Colusa LAFCO meeting is scheduled for December 7th, 2023.

- **6.** Colusa Basin Drainage District (CBDD)
 - 1. Review LAFCo Counsel Opinion regarding the Colusa Basin Drainage District:

Scott Browne, LAFCo Legal Counsel, determined and confirmed CBDD is subject to LAFCO, therefore a Municipal Service Review (MSR) would be in order.

2. Presentation from Merrilee Vanderwall, Manager of the Colusa Basin Drainage District regarding district activities:

Ben King gave some history of the Colusa Basin Drainage District and stated there are a lot of issues to flush out in the MSR.

Merrilee Vanderwall, CBDD District Manager agreed with LAFCo Counsel's determination. Merrilee Vanderwall explained this is a multi-county special district with boundaries encompassing Colusa, Glenn and Yolo counties. She discussed the history of the district, their past and present goals, assessments, debts, audits and a 2000 acre ranch previously purchased by the district. Merrilee Vanderwall explained the ranch was purchased to build a detention dam as part of an integrative development plan, however due to inadequate funding the damn was never built.

Ben King explained he had run for a seat on the CBDD board but lost the election. He feels funds may have been misallocated and that some of the funds should go back to the public.

7. Review of the Calafco Annual Conference from October 18-20th.

John Benoit summarized some of the sessions that were held during the conference such as: Out of Agency Agreement's, Every LAFCO has a District that Goes Adrift, and Fire Services.

Commissioner Ponciano stated he was glad he had some LAFCo knowledge prior to going to the conference and thought the conference was a valuable experience.

8. LAFCo Regular meeting schedule for 2024.

Action: Upon motion from Commissioner Ash, and a second from Commissioner Boes, the motion was carried, and the Commission unanimously approved the 2024 meeting agenda.
