Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56100.1, 56300(b), 56700.1, and 81000 et seq., and Colusa LAFCO's Policies and Procedures for the Disclosure of Contributions and Expenditures in Support of and Opposition to Proposals, any

person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contribute \$1000 or more or expend \$1000 or more in support of or opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Colusa LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements approved by Colusa LAFCO. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals. A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

1. Call to Order/Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 3:03 p.m. There was a quorum present.

2. Consider Minutes for December 1, 2016

On motion of T. Reische, second by D. Carter, the commission approved the minutes of the December 1, 2016 meeting; motion carried. (3-2-0)

- 3. Public Comment None
- 4. Consent Agenda

On motion of D. Carter, second by T. Reische, the commission approved payment of the December 2016 and January 2017 claims, motion carried by roll call vote. (5-0)

- 5. LAFCO #2016-0003, Abel Tract Annex to the Westside Water District
 - J. Benoit presented the Executive Officer's report regarding the annexation of 531.70 acres more or less to the Westside Water District to provide surface water to the annexation territory. He stated that a public hearing is not required. The district is requesting annexation to enable surface water supplies to be distributed on the property. No additional CVP water is requested for the proposed annexation and this annexation will benefit the district by enabling it to distribute water from potential future water sources such as the Sites Reservoir, as it becomes available.
 - D. Carter stated that she is concerned about the adequacy of the water. It was suggested that a memo could be provided from the district concerning this issue. The memo will incorporate numbers and confirm that they have the water. There is a need to approve the resolution today due to timelines.
 - D. Carter moved to approve Resolution 2017-0001 making determination and approving the annexation of 531.70 acres to the Westside Water District, with the understanding that a memo be submitted stating that they have the

amount of water needed to service the additional acreage, second by J. Loudon, motion carried by roll call vote. (5-0)

- 6. Authorize staff to attend the Calafco staff workshop in Fresno March 4-7, 2017
 - S. Browne will be attending the conference. J. Benoit has not decided.

7. Meeting with State Water Resources Control Board/Division of Drinking Water staff

Commissioners were provided a copy of the letter from the State Water Resources Control Board regarding SB 1263, Changes to Domestic Water Supply Permit Applications.

SB 1266 is a new bill proposing that LAFCos regulate JPAs for urban service providers. This would not apply to every JPA. It would be the JPAs responsibility to file with LAFCo.

8. Establish Ad Hoc Budget Committee for FY 2017-2018

John stated that LAFCo has had an ad hoc committee for a number of years now. The purpose of the committee is to analyze the budget. The shadow accounting helps with this process.

M. Winters and D. Carter volunteered to sit on the ad hoc committee.

- 9. Grant a three month's extension for LAFCo file 2015-0002 for the Vedo Annexation to obtain verification of filing of the Certificate of Compliance by Colusa County and final descriptions and mapping.
 - J. Benoit stated that the City of Colusa needs to get this done. A map and description are needed, and once received, can be recorded. The permit will expire in two days. T. Reische stated that he will talk to Brian Stice regarding this issue.

On motion of J. Loudon, second by D. Carter, the commission agreed to a three month extension; until the May LAFCo meeting, motion carried. (5-0)

10. Executive Officer's Report

- Form 700's are due in April
- John asked which commissioners would like to receive electronic agendas.
- Berlin Water District John has a map, and stated that there is much incorrect information on the map. They want to form a GSA to manage groundwater.

D. Carter provided information on the Berlin Water District and their plans for the future. They are not yet a district. She stated that there are a lot of good reasons to form a district in that area. More discussion followed.

Subject: Annexation or Formation of Water District Without Water Supply

First, I want to thank you for the opportunity to speak with you yesterday and discuss my District's future along with many other issues. It was quite insightful and I appreciated the level of detail.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to caution the Board in regards to how it approaches its view of the link between Water District annexations and water supply. I wouldn't want to limit folks whom are willing to basically tax themselves in order to form or join a District for benefits they have concluded are worth it. As I mentioned yesterday, there are benefits to creating or joining a District even without water supply. Just having the ability to put CVP water on its grounds adds value to a property within the District veil. Only through this recognized annexation process will Reclamation permit Federal water to be delivered to properties, whereas without, Districts would be in violation of our contracts which could threaten the entire District's ability to deliver water. In wet years where supplies are abundant, we need to share this resource and put water to use where it is needed most. In addition, approving annexations contingent on water supply also limits their ability to take advantage of future potential water supply opportunities, as we spoke about yesterday. Sites Reservoir is the first opportunity of "new" water for Northern California Contractors in decades; to limit folks whom are willing to take on the risks associated with this investment, would effectively limit our flexibility to deal with several issues, some we aren't even aware of today. One example we spoke about yesterday was the benefits of the potential formation of a new Water District called Berlin. There is an interesting bit of history tied to the name you should be aware of. Here we have a group of private landowners willing to tax themselves in order to simply have representation at a future Board table, without any certain water supply. Again, I wouldn't want to limit our flexibility as agencies in a time when we need as many tools as possible.

As we all move forward, our learning curve will be steep, the link between surface water and ground water does exist, to what extent, only future studies and large costs associated with those studies will reveal. Agencies, such as ours, need to continue to recognize the need to work together, looking beyond our boundaries for opportunities to keep our region sustainable. I commend the County's efforts thus far and look forward to working with you all in the future.
