The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

The meeting was called to order at 3:03 p.m. There was a quorum present.

MSR and SOI for Reclamation, Flood Control and Levee Districts

The MSR and SOI was distributed at the June 2018 LAFCo meeting and reviewed at the July 2018. Several Comments were brought up.

Lewis Bair of RD 108 was contacted regarding RD 108's water rights.
 An additional paragraph needs to be added to Section 2.1.1 on page 11 as follows.

"When Shasta Dam was built in the late 1940s, the newly constructed Central Valley Project created uncertainty for the historic water users on the Sacramento River. The issue was that the stored water from the reservoir was co-mingled with the rivers natural flows. The stored water was considered to be property of the Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) and the natural flows included the water rights of historic water users. In 1964 USBR entered into a water right Settlement Contract with Sacramento River Water Users that preserved their prior and historic water rights and provided for some supplemental water during the summer months from the Central Valley Project. RD 108 has a 232,000 acre-foot under this USBR contract with that covers April 1 through October 31. The District also has a winter water right and other senior water rights and riparian water rights that cover the winter months for decomposed rice straw and winter floodplain habitat".

- Terry Bressler at RD 1004 was contacted and he indicated the RD 1004 Board of Directors does not desire to annex other territory into its district at this time. Therefore, the RD 1004 Sphere of Influence Map is to remain as proposed.
- Addresses and phone numbers for members of the District Board of Directors shall be removed throughout the document (p37).

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 56425 requires that a Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") adopt and periodically review Sphere of Influence Plans for all agencies in its jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 56430 requires that a LAFCO conduct a review of the municipal services provided by and within an agency prior to updating and adopting its Sphere of Influence Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Sphere of Influence Plan is the primary planning tool for LAFCO and defines the probable physical boundaries and service area of a local agency as determined by LAFCO; and,

WHEREAS, on June 3rd, 2004, the Commission adopted its Work Plan and included a schedule for initiation of Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) and Spheres of Influence; and

WHEREAS, the Commission adopted Resolution 2009-0009 on May 7th, 2009 containing policies and standards related to the preparation of MSRs, which applies to this MSR for services provided by the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District; and,

WHEREAS, at the time and in the manner provided by law, the Executive Officer gave notice of the date, time, and place of a public hearing by the Commission for services provided in Colusa County by the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, including approval of the report and adoption of the written determinations contained therein; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission hereby determines that the hearing draft of the Municipal Service Review for services provided by and within the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District and written determinations contained therein will provide information for updating the Sphere of Influence of the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, and is otherwise consistent with the purposes and responsibility of the Commission for planning the logical and orderly development and coordination of local governmental agencies so as to advantageously provide for the present and future needs of the county and its communities; and,

WHEREAS, in making this determination, the Commission has considered the documentation on file in this matter; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission has heard all interested parties desiring to be heard and has considered the proposal and report by the Executive Officer and all other relevant evidence and information presented at said hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Colusa Local Agency Formation Commission hereby resolves, orders and determines the following:

- 1) The Municipal Service Review of services provided in the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, attached hereto as Exhibit A, is approved and the written determinations presented in the Municipal Service Review report are hereby adopted.
- 2) LAFCO staff is further ordered to proceed as appropriate with update to the Sphere of Influence Plan of the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.
- 3) LAFCO staff is further ordered to forward copies of this resolution containing the adopted Municipal Service Review to the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 56425 requires each Local Agency Formation Commission to adopt and periodically review and update a sphere of influence for each local governmental agency within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Local Agency Formation Commission of Colusa County, in compliance with the aforementioned requirement, is providing a "plan for the probable physical boundaries and service area" for the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has set the hearing date of September 6, 2018, for the update of the sphere of influence for the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District and has noticed this hearing at the times and as otherwise prescribed by Government Code Section 56150, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heard and previously adopted a Municipal Services Review of services provided by the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District in accordance with Gov. Code section 56430; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has reviewed and considered the proposed Sphere of Influence update report and the proposed Sphere of Influence Update Map which are

attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, Colusa LAFCO prepared a Notice of Exemption for such action since there is no change in the proposed boundaries except a reduction in size; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has considered those factors determined by it to be relevant to the proposed sphere of influence update, including, but not limited to, those factors specified in Government Code Section 56425, et seq., and has heard from interested parties and considered requests for amendment and/or revision of the proposed updated sphere boundary, if any;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Local Agency Formation Commission of Colusa County does hereby find and determine as follows:

- 1. That the proposed sphere of influence update with respect to the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District complies with the provisions of Government Code Section 56000, et seq.
- 2. That no significant protests have been received regarding the establishment of this Sphere of Influence update.
- 3. That, pursuant to Government Code Section 56425, the Commission makes and adopts those determinations set forth in the Sphere of Influence Study are attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 4. The Colusa Local Agency Formation Commission hereby finds this Sphere update exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act.
- 5. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56425 (i) the Reclamation District 108, Reclamation District 479, Reclamation District 1004, Reclamation District 2047, Sacramento River Westside Levee District, Cortina Creek Flood Control and Floodwater Conservation District, Knights Landing Ridge Drainage District, Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District is authorized to provide domestic water services within its territory. Other services provided by this District shall be considered latent powers.

PART 1. GENERAL

CHAPTER 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS

Title 56000. This division shall be known and may be cited as the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000.

LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS: STATE INTERESTS:

56001. The Legislature finds and declares that it is the policy of the state to encourage orderly growth and development which are essential to the social, fiscal, and economic well-being of the state. The Legislature recognizes that the logical formation and determination of local agency boundaries is an important factor in promoting orderly development and in balancing that development with sometimes competing state interests of discouraging urban sprawl, preserving open-space and prime agricultural lands, and efficiently extending government services. The Legislature also recognizes that providing housing for persons and families of all incomes is an important factor in promoting orderly development. Therefore, the Legislature further finds and declares that this policy should be effected by the logical formation and modification of the boundaries of local agencies, with a preference granted to accommodating additional growth within, or through the expansion of, the boundaries of those local agencies which can best accommodate and provide necessary governmental services and housing for persons and families of all incomes in the most efficient manner feasible.

The Legislature recognizes that urban population densities and intensive residential, commercial, and industrial development necessitate a broad spectrum and high level of community services and controls. The Legislature also recognizes that when areas become urbanized to the extent that they need the full range of community services, priorities are required to be established regarding the type and levels of services that the residents of an urban community need and desire; that community service priorities be established by weighing the total community service needs against the total financial resources available for securing community services; and that those community service priorities are required to reflect local circumstances, conditions and limited financial resources. The Legislature finds and declares that a single multipurpose governmental agency is accountable for community service needs and financial resources and, therefore, may be the best mechanism for establishing community service

priorities especially in urban areas. Nonetheless, the Legislature recognizes the critical role of many limited purpose agencies, especially in rural communities. The Legislature also finds that, whether governmental services are proposed to be provided by a single-purpose agency, several agencies, or a multipurpose agency, responsibility should be given to the agency or agencies that can best provide government services.

DEFINITION OF A DISTRICT:

"District" or "special district"

- 56036. (a) "District" or "special district" are synonymous and mean an agency of the state, formed pursuant to general law or special act, for the local performance of governmental or proprietary functions within limited boundaries and in areas outside district boundaries when authorized by the commission pursuant to Section 56133.
- (b) "District" or "special district" includes a county service area, but excludes all of the following:
 - (1) The state.
 - (2) A county.
 - (3) A city.
 - (4) A school district or a community college district.
 - (5) An assessment district or special assessment district.
 - (6) An improvement district.
- (7) A community facilities district formed pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, (Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 53311) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5).
- (8) A permanent road division formed pursuant to Article 3 (commencing with Section 1160) of Chapter 4 of Division 2 of the Streets and Highways Code.
- (9) An air pollution control district or an air quality maintenance district.
- (10) A zone of any special district.

Change of organization; principal act

- 56036.5. (a) For the purposes of Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 57000) to Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 57176), inclusive, of Part 4 or Part 5 (commencing with Section 57300), for each of the following entities proceedings for a change of organization shall be conducted pursuant to the principal act authorizing the establishment of that district:
- (1) A unified or union high school library district.
- (2) A bridge and highway district.
- (3) A joint highway district.
- (4) A transit or rapid transit district.

- (5) A metropolitan water district.
- (6) A separation of grade district.
- (7) For other districts, where the principal act provides, the procedures in the principal act shall supersede the procedures set forth in this division.

Non-districts

56036.6. (a) For the purposes of Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 57000) to Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 57176), inclusive, of Part 4 or Part 5 (commencing with Section 57300), none of the following entities is a "district" or "special district" if the commission of the principal county determines, in accordance with Section 56127 and 56128, that the entity is not a "district" or "special district":

- (1) A flood control district.
- (2) A flood control and floodwater conservation district.
- (3) A flood control and water conservation district.
- (4) A conservation district.
- (5) A water conservation district.
- (6) A water replenishment district.
- (7) The Orange County Water District.
- (8) A California water storage district.
- (9) A water agency.
- (10) A county water authority or a water authority.
- (b) If the commission determines that an entity described in this section is not a "district" or "special district," any proceedings pursuant to Part 4 (commencing with Section 57000) for a change of organization involving the entity shall be conducted pursuant to the principal act authorizing the establishment of that entity.
